- Whisks

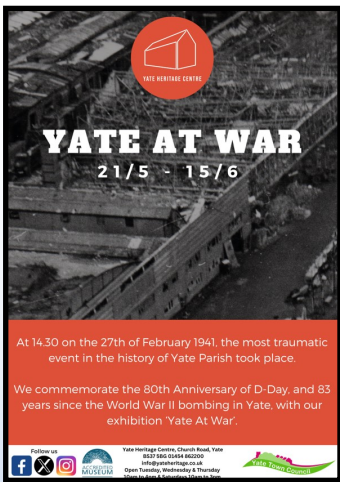
**Y6—Y7 Transition Workshop 10 July 2024**
