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#### <u>English</u>

Play 'Panagrams'

Players: Two or more

Players alternate in adding a letter to a word, to make an anagram of a new word.

The first player starts with a three-letter word. The next player tries to find a four-letter word by adding a letter and making an anagram of all the letters.

The players continue in this way, making longer and longer anagrams. The first player unable to make a word loses.

Play 'Consequences'

Players: Two or more The players take turns in contributing sentences to a story. The final story is then read out.

Each player starts with a piece of paper. The players each write a phrase as the first step in a story, and then fold the paper to hide the phrase before passing it to the next player.

The steps are as follows, where the things in brackets should be replaced by the chosen words or phrase:

(boy's name) She said (what she said) (what happened). met (girl's name) He (what he did) in/at/on (where they met). She (what she did) He said (what he said) The consequence was

When the players have completed all eight steps, the pieces of paper are unfolded in turn, and the players read out the completed, usually funny, stories. See how to start your story:


